

NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety

Who should attend

Managers, supervisors and staff from all types of organisations who need a broad understanding of health and safety issues. The certificate helps them manage risks effectively. Many people take the NEBOSH National General Certificate as a first step in a career in health and safety. It provides a valuable overview, and is a sound basis for further professional study.

Course information

Overview

The NEBOSH National General Certificate covers the main legal requirements for health and safety in the UK, identification and control of workplace hazards, and the practical application of this knowledge. No previous health and safety knowledge is required but candidates should note the assessment includes a requirement to write a short report.

The qualification is divided into two units, each of which is assessed separately:

- Management of Health and Safety (NG1)
- Risk assessment (NG2)

The new specification recommends 113 hours of learning compared to 133 hours.

Delegates studying the previous specification have up to 31 March 2022 to complete the assessments.

You'll have 5 years to complete your NEBOSH General Certificate. This time frame starts from when you pass your first exam.

Minimum standard of English required for candidates

The standard of English required by candidates studying for the NEBOSH National General Certificate must be such that they can both understand and articulate the concepts contained in the syllabus. It is important to stress that the onus is on accredited course providers to determine their candidates' standards of proficiency in English. NEBOSH recommends to accredited course providers that candidates undertaking this qualification should reach a minimum standard of English equivalent to an International English Language Testing System score of 6.0 or higher in IELTS tests in order to be accepted onto a National General Certificate programme.

Exemptions

The National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety is a standalone qualification i.e. it does not share units with or allow exemptions from other NEBOSH qualifications.

Learner Numbers

In order to ensure the interaction between the learners and the tutor is spread evenly and effectively, the maximum number of learners allowed on a course is twelve.

Assessment

Unit NG1 is a taught unit which is assessed by a two-hour written examination. This written examination consists of ten 'short-answer' questions and one 'long-answer' question. All questions are compulsory. The exam takes an 'open book' format which enables learners to sit their assessment in their own home or another safe and suitable location. Learners are given 24 hours to research and complete the examination. All NG1 Open Book Exam dates are currently set by NEBOSH.

Unit NG2 is assessed by a three-hour practical examination carried out in the candidate's own workplace. The assessment must normally be taken within 10 working days of a written examination.

Both assessments are marked by external examiners appointed by NEBOSH. These examiners are chosen for their experience and expertise to ensure that learners are assessed by the very best from our industry.

Candidates will be awarded a unit certificate for each unit passed. Once a candidate has successfully completed both units (NG1 and NG2), the overall qualification parchment will be issued.

Certification

NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety.

Holders of NEBOSH National General Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety are entitled to Associate Membership (AIOSH) of the Institution of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH). The qualification also meets the academic requirements for Technical membership (Tech IOSH) of the Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH – www.iosh.co.uk) and Associate membership (AIIRSM) of the International Institute of Risk and Safety Management (IIRSM – www.iirsm.org).

Is this qualification recognised?

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The NEBOSH National General Certificate has been accredited and credit rated by the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA). It sits in the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) at SCQF Level 6 with 15 SCQF credit points.
